Forklift License Mesa - In North America, getting forklift certification or a forklift license involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators can obtain a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial equipment which is designed together with many options, like for example stand-up and sit down models, propane and electric versions, and different types and sizes to meet the industrial needs of employees. Operator training programs are often individualized in order to deal with the particular kinds and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered forklift in a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up forklift in a shipyard. The various lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all equipment and businesses. Regulatory standards, hence, have a tendency not to concentrate on particular course requirements but rather on the results of individual training programs.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common method for operators to obtain their forklift certification or license. This method of certification needs the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on machines within the workplace. Employers can choose to train workers on each and every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The curriculum incorporates lift truck operation procedures, safety procedures, company rules and lift truck maintenance. Subject matters particular to the worksite, like hazardous materials or conditions, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate each and every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually requires an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

Normally, a certification provided by an employer will not transfer from the existing employer to the next employer. Receiving a lift truck license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a forklift for that employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an important factor of the lift truck license training, although the particulars of the safety training would be dependent upon the equipment being utilized. Certain safety problems will differ for each industry and employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to address extra requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like for instance in offshore and marine uses.
